The intent to communicate, however, makes viewers a part of recognition and the validation process. They are the ultimate pools of judgments and the means of acting upon them. If that happens, a photograph becomes a platform of shared realities.

The photographs I aim to take are images of what you would see being in place of my camera, keeping your eyes and mind wide open. Each is generated in a predetermined location to occupy a role in the narration of my visual story.

Mission Statement

I had a day in my life reflecting about the past, assessing where was I in it that day. I finished it with an ironic image in my head that resembled the impressive cruising RV, moving on roads not designed for it, blurs in windows, arts installed as sleeping pills, and no working breaks.
